Generaciones: Cuerpo, Mente, Alma y Cultura, a program of The Performance Project is a group of teenage young ladies who live in the North End of Springfield, Massachusetts seeking to recognize Latina women activists who also are from the North End, and have come together to create a mural dedicated to them. Directed by Señora Julissa Rodriguez, who herself is a Latina activist, the group is working on

the mural which is on three wooden panels at Chestnut Accelerated Middle School. For several months, the members of Generaciones have been interviewing North End women activists to collect information about what those activists have done in and for their community. The members of Generaciones currently in the group are the following: Nsabimana Hawa, Linda, Letti, and Germarys, Julie Lichtenberg (the director's assistant) and, of course, Julissa Rodriguez, the director.
